Book Review: Field Notes, Commentaries on Leadership and Facilities Management, Published by APPA: The Association of Higher Education Facilities Officers

ow and then, in any discipline or pursuit there comes along a book that stands out. Field Notes by James E. Christenson is one. During the 90's and so far this decade, we have seen an endless amount of books and articles on leadership; enough to fill a large room. There are a few that are worth the purchase price and the retention. For those in the facilities management profession, especially those who are searching for the leadership and management connection, this is the book for you. Jim Christenson, formerly the director of plant operations at the University of Michigan brings his 40 plus years of experience in "--what good facilities management and good leadership look like--" to print.

As I read the book, three key summary points stand out. They are that the book is focused, practical in application, and concise. While the book includes a range of topics from change to the outdoor environment, it does not lose track of the central theme; what leadership and management in the facilities profession is all about. Jim makes us aware in the foreword that the book is a collection of columns and articles that appeared in APPA's Facilities Manager during the past 5 plus years. They were written in response, in part, to events that were current at the time. However, each of the topics retains their applicability today.

Jim distills a career of observation, teaching, practice, and participation in facilities leadership and management into 25 chapters and 149 pages, including a helpful bibliography. For a subject of such breadth, that is concise.

The chapters address dealing with change, defining leadership, sharing power, decision making, performance assessment and more. One section addresses the nuts and bolts of our business. Then the author concludes with a final challenge to leaders.

Education Committee Happenings

s I sit to write my annual article for the Chapter newsletter, another busy summer has come and is now almost gone. The students on our campus are back and things are cranking up to their normal frantic pace. Dealing with all the usual issues we all juggle with every fall reminds of my colleagues across the region dealing with the same things, and how by comparing notes, sharing war stories and innovative solutions that have been tried, we've all learned and benefited from our association with the Chapter. The drive to keep improving and become more effective continues on, and the Education Committee strives to keep the Chapter's programs current and applicable.

The Education Committee's primary focus since the spring meeting in Portland has been to assist the Fall Conference Nashua NH Host Committee in preparing a first class series of education programs. The Committee members worked with the Host Committee to put together programs for two tracks, one focused on the trades and another on regulatory compliance, and a special 4 part program on understanding and using design and construction contracts lead by a noted attorney and expert in the field. This latter program will have a modest extra fee, but will also include an APPA publication on construction administration.

Since the spring meeting, we have also unveiled, introduced, and are currently accepting applications for Business Partner originated education programs that can be available for future Host Committees or member institutions that want to use these programs for in-service training. A number of Business Partners have already proposed programs for the listing and the first such programs should become approved and available for use following the Nashua meeting.

Regionally, our chapter has also been active. The Education Program Standards and Guidelines document we created last year for our chapter is now being looked at for adoption by ERAPPA for the entire region for it's annual conferences. I have also been asked to work with the Education Committee Chairs from the Southern New England and Ontario Provinces Chapters to develop a regional program on project delivery methods which we will hopefully be able to unveil at next year's ERAPPA conference in Mystic, CT.
