

he staffs of the Facilities departments at Dartmouth College are looking forward to hosting the Fall 2006 NNECERAPPA Conference on November 14, 2006. It is a one day conference instead of the normal two day event because Dartmouth is in session during the fall and we are not able to

provide all the spaces necessary for an event if this size when we are in session. However, we have a great program lined up for everyone with the theme, "Building Smart(er)".

Dartmouth will have five new buildings completed this fall, all to be LEED silver certified. Our program will tell the story of how we, and you, can build better, less expensive (long term) buildings when the design team works together to design more efficient envelopes which require fewer and smaller systems to heat and cool them. In addition, when using innovative, new ideas for heating, cooling and storm water management, we will show how operating costs can be trimmed significantly. We will have two tracks that will involve tours of some of these new buildings in one session and the next session will be with a consultant who will talk about some of the specific innovative ideas used in the buildings.

Our day will open with a talk for everyone by Marc Rosenbaum, a

There are also two other two tracks that will have a variety of subjects ranging from synthetic turf field choices to fall protection safety and issues of monitoring safety programs, and a roundtable for K-12 members who are trying to avoid pitfalls that we all seem to experience when building new facilities.

Have you or any of your colleagues ever attended the Institute for Facilities Management, an excellent educational program offered by the APPA organization, held twice a year in the spring and fall? If so, you may have taken advantage of our chapter scholarship program. Twelve full chapter scholarships to the Institute are available each year (two per state in the spring, and two more per state in the fall).

You may not be aware that the chapter also provides half scholarships to all other APPA, ERAPPA and NNECERAPPA educational programs such as the APPA Leadership Academy, the Supervisor's Toolkit, annual APPA and ERAPPA meetings, as well as our own chapter meetings. So if you have wanted to attend any of these programs yourself, but budgets have been tight, a scholarship may be the way to go. Sending an employee is also a great way to show that you want to invest in their place in your organization. A scholarship can help make that happen, and your employee will get not only some needed training but also a vote of confidence from you, ensuring continued loyalty on the job.

HOW CAN YOU MAKE IT HAPPEN?

You can obtain a scholarship application through a number of avenues:

- *Download a scholarship application from the chapter website: www.erappa.org/nne.
- *Access the web-based form and submit on line.
- *A scholarship application can also be found in the NNEC Membership Directory.
- *You can request a scholarship application from any chapter board member.
- *Simply fill it out, have your Supervisor and your Institutional Representative (usually your Facilities Director) give you an endorsement and submit electronically, or mail it, fax it, or e-mail it to your state director.

Applications received prior to the Spring or Fall Chapter meeting are considered for use within one year from the date awarded.
